Patients with immune thrombocytopenia (ITP) are at increased risk for bleeding episodes, but, paradoxically, are also at increased risk for thrombosis. Many patients with ITP have underlying cardiovascular disease and/or other thrombotic risk factors; thus, careful consideration of competing clinical factors is needed when selecting the appropriate therapeutic agent. In addition, patient preferences should also be considered in individualized treatment for patients.

In this symposium, experts on ITP will provide insights on the relevance of thrombotic risk in ITP patients as well as an update on the impact of various ITP treatments on thromboembolic events. Finally, a conversation between a physician and a patient will be held to better understand the patient's perspective and vision.
